**(22) Shelter-Related Construction Projects** taken on for local nonprofits - all providing supportive housing solutions and support to help to families and individuals in need.

**Over 1,500 individuals / family members were sheltered annually** at our project sites. Thousands more were provided additional means of support by our nonprofit partners this year.

Taken together, these project sites provide **336 supportive shelter bed units** for vulnerable individuals and family members. By providing well-functioning and safe living environments that promote stability and dignity, we help safeguard and strengthen our communities.

**We invested close to \$500,000 into the Maryland community** to help the homeless, victims of domestic violence, the disabled, low-income seniors, persons in recovery and families needing special care - all in partnership with our nonprofit partners.

### Who We Help

HBCF partners with other local nonprofits to help vulnerable populations in need of safe shelter and supportive services such as:



- homeless men, women and children and families
- at-risk veterans
- victims of domestic violence
- youth aging out of foster care
- the physically-disabled
- persons with mental health issues
- pregnant women / young mothers in need
- elderly, low income persons
- persons suffering with major illnesses
- ex-offenders in need of support
- persons in recovery from substance abuse
- families in crisis and more.

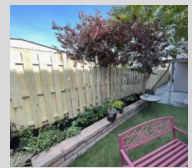
### 2025 PROJECT HIGHLIGHTS

#### Ribbon Cutting with Believe in Tomorrow Children’s Foundation

HBCF was part of the team that constructed two new townhomes for families of critically ill children. The new Ocean City pediatric respite properties provide a place for families to heal and create new memories amid the many stresses of medical challenges & hospital stays.



**Revitalizing Earls Place** The backyard at this transitional housing program for men in Baltimore City was transformed into an urban oasis thanks to Atlantic Maintenance Group. With improved grading, plantings, cnew oncrete and fencing, the men now have a more welcoming space to enjoy as they move towards stability.



**Helping Drink At The Well Inc. Create Safe Spaces** A 2BR unit of supportive housing was beautifully restored thanks to HBCF. The Well is a community of women providing a circle of support to help women survivors on their healing journey in Baltimore.



**Assisting Poiema with the Grand Opening of El Roi House** HBCF was proud to help the Poiema Movement in Charles County complete the finishing touches on the construction of their beautiful new home providing transitional housing and support to women with children.



**Replacing the Exterior at Rockland House** The roof and siding at this home for formerly homeless women was in bad shape, and funding for an expensive replacement was scarce for Community Reach of Montgomery County. Thanks to Miller and Smith, John Darvish Construction, and S.B.S. Siding Co., the property is now more comfortable for its five residents.
